
GIVING HOPE TO THOSE WHO HAVE NONE

HOSPITALITY AND HOPE

Without hope it is very difficult for anyone to flourish. With hope we are strengthened. With hope we can overcome obstacles, embrace new experiences and move forward in ways previously considered impossible. Our aim at Matthew's House is to be hope-givers. By supporting us with your time, services, resources or money, you can make a difference by providing someone with life giving hope.

Your generous support will enable us to offer the most vulnerable: hot meals, refreshments, community, showers, laundry facilities, emotional support, practical gifts, training, dignity and hope. Working with others, Matthew's House will continue to be a beacon of hope in Swansea.

Recorded statutory homeless acceptances in Wales remain 70% higher than in England pro-rata population.¹

There are an estimated 347 rough sleepers in Wales – 33 in Swansea for 2018-19. This does not include the much higher number of people in hostels, temporary accommodation, B&Bs, sofa surfing – all of whom are also 'homeless'.⁴

There is a greater prevalence of diagnosed mental health conditions, such as depression, amongst homeless people (39% in women and 33% in men).²

Over 1 in 4 girls experience period poverty and 137,000 girls miss school each year as a result.⁵ 1,160 households in Swansea recorded as homeless, or threatened with homelessness.³

Swansea is one of the top 10 areas experiencing drug related deaths in the whole of the UK.⁶

Since we opened we have signposted and worked alongside more than 100 charities, businesses, groups and organisations to give hope and support to the most vulnerable in Swansea and surrounding areas.*

On average we serve **over 2,000 meals a month**together with the hope and community that Matthew's
House delivers.*

In a typical month we intercept over a tonne of food, **saving over 50 tonnes of food from landfill** since
March 2017.*

We hand out more than 30 dignity packs every single week to women and men in need*

Every month we provide more than 15 emergency items and food to those in need, often people struggling with homelessness or sleeping rough*

In our first year we served more than 11,000 meals feeding the most vulnerable in Swansea. By our third birthday we had served more than **60,000**!

Key expressions of **Matthew's House**





Matt's Cafe

We intercept food waste destined for landfill and use it to feed people who need it, on a pay-as-you feel basis.



The Homeless Period

We collect, create and distribute Dignity Packs to vulnerable women and men who cannot afford essential hygiene products.



Matt's Showers

We offer dignity through a homely large shower room to the city's rough sleepers and most vulnerable people on a referral system.



Matt's Laundry

We seek to provide a referral based laundry service focused to serve rough sleepers in our city.



Matt's Cwtsh

We have created a safe place to offer friendly advocacy and support from trained volunteers to anyone in need at Matthew's House.*



Matt's Community Choir

We use music and friendship to reduce isolation and improve wellbeing.*

THE STORY OF MATTHEW'S HOUSE

Matthew's House began in 2016 when The Hill Church purchased the Grade 2 listed building, called St Matthew's Church. It had a history of serving the poorest and most vulnerable in our city, but it had been closed for nearly two years. Following the purchase, months of volunteer hours were donated to turn the building into Matthew's House – a house of hospitality and hope in the heart of Swansea.

In 2017 Matt's Cafe was launched. This was the first expression of Matthew's House. The concept was simple. Intercept perfectly edible food destined for bins by local supermarkets and turn it into delicious 'home-cooked' style meals available to all, but particularly those who are homeless or vulnerable. It would be funded on a pay-as-you-feel basis. All the expressions of Matthew's House succeed because of the compassionate and tireless work of volunteers – we have over 90! All of them are motivated to give hospitality and hope to others.

The Hill Church

The Hill Church is a registered charity. It considers itself as a guardian of the building to preserve its use over the long-term for the good of the city. They work with those in Swansea who seek to assist the homeless and most vulnerable. Matthew's House has a separate bank account to the rest of The Hill Church, so that all monies donated are only ever used for the purpose, development and maintenance of Matthew's House.

STORIES

We measure our success in several ways, but the most effective way through the stories of those we seek to support. The stories included here are true^{*}, and represent many other lives that are being impacted.

Family really matters. Love matters. Time matters. Goodbye matters.

We received an early visit to Matthew's House on a fresh autumn Monday morning. As we were not yet open, one of the team spoke to the guest and reminded him of our opening times as he was a regular. The guest was a man who seemed more confused than normal and not his usual self. Within the first few minutes the guest collapsed on the doorstep with a seizure. Following this, he lost consciousness and went into cardiac arrest. The volunteers called 999, whilst a member of the team began to render first aid to the gentleman. Approximately 15 minutes passed before the paramedics arrived. They took over, but our team member was asked to continue compressions as they setup and did what they needed to do. Sadly, with the length of time unconscious, the gentleman was put on life support. This lasted more than 7 days before it was decided by the medical staff and his family that they had to withdraw the support. He passed away in hospital soon after.

The guest was a lonely and vulnerable man. After he was transferred to hospital the Matthew's House team took care of his possessions and used his mobile phone to make contact with his family - all of whom lived a very long distance away. As a consequence of this, the family, including his children, were able to travel to Swansea and visit him at the bedside and say their goodbyes. The guest's brother visited Matthew's House the day following his passing and thanked the entire team for their care, compassion and swift action which led to his brother surviving for a week, enabling them all time to say goodbye and thanking them for being part of his life. For us it was a precious reminder that every guest almost certainly has a history and a family somewhere. They are somebody's wife, husband, child, brother, sister, uncle or auntie. Often, for a number of reasons, the families have not been able to maintain contact despite their best efforts; sometimes due to the guests' lifestyles or other challenges. Yet in the end and at the end, family really matters. Love matters. Time matters. Goodbye matters.

Anna's Story

Anna is a lady in her early 60s who first came to Matt's Cafe during a time when she was sleeping rough. She was receiving a pension that was not enough to get by and found herself in between places to live. On her first visit Anna had a small breakfast, and returned at lunch time for some "delicious" fish pie. This is when she discovered that we had a shower available and were offering

haircuts that day. So, Anna had a full belly, a hot shower and a new hairdo. Before leaving, Anna shared that she was on her way to meet a landlord in the hope of having a new flat that evening. She told us that she felt "absolutely fab" and was so thankful for all the help. "I'm walking out a different person! I've even got doughnuts with me!"

Dan's Story (written from Dan's perspective)

It was summer and my life was quite a struggle. It was full of hurt, frustration, I was really lonely and most of the time I just felt upset. I had neighbours that bullied me, made me feel awful and attacked me and ultimately, I found myself pushed out and left homeless, thinking it was the safest option I had. The days were long and the hardest days for me were when it rained. I was already drinking a little, but with everything that was going on, the feelings, the loneliness, the hurt, I started drinking and feeling sadder than ever. Whilst on the streets during the long hard days I met a lot of people, many picked on me, many used and took advantage of me especially when I managed to get my money, but they weren't all bad. One or two of them introduced me to a place called Matt's Cafe and with the long, hungry and lonely days, I thought why not? I've got to give it a try.

When I went in for the first time it felt great. I had some good food and that's where I met "my Sally". My Sally is the lady that runs

the Matt's Cafe project and from day one she was the standout star, the one who showed me that some people really do care. I started helping as more days passed and they let me, I just wanted to help the people who were helping me and give something back. After about a month of meeting my new friends at Matt's Cafe they helped me fill in an application form, they helped me through my interview and the next day they welcomed me not just as a guest but as a volunteer. They gave me a chance and it really felt like a miracle, especially when I got to put that bright red pinny on.

From that summer I started to smile again, I started to find out what real friendship felt like and I had something in my life that was worth being part of. Having a new purpose, less time feeling alone and being hurt, a place where I could grow and with people, I really loved ... I really appreciate everything Matthew's House and its angels have done for me – they really have changed my life!

Grace's story

My mum passed away and my life started to go downhill. Struggling with many things, in particular isolation and addiction, I became very lost. One day I just knew I needed to make the decision to seek help and change. In wanting to go forward I decided to volunteer somewhere. This was when I found out about Matthew's House, and the work of Matt's Cafe. I volunteered to give back and to help others in a similar situation to my own, but what I found was that it helped me most of all! I truly began to find myself. my confidence and my self-

worth again. I fell in love with Matthew's House and became part of its kind, loving and generous family. After volunteering for a while, I felt confident enough to apply to university and find paid part-time work. Prior to volunteering at the Cafe these things were just dreams, but because of the support and encouragement of the people at Matthew's House I was able to make it a reality. I truly believe that without them, and their belief in me, even when I did not believe in myself, none of this would have been possible – they are super heroes!
